TEC in Wales

Several pilots funded by Welsh Government in 2014/15

 Study by Mid Wales Health Collaborative showed approach to TEC in Wales has been slow and fragmented.

 Each Health Board has had some success in delivering Telehealth pilots to support patients and deliver better outcomes.

No mechanism to upscale pilots and deliver best practice

TELEMEDICINE

Medical care carried out through video conferencing tools.

This could involve consultations between patients and clinicians in order to monitor, diagnose and treat ill health or a means to provide peer to peer support.



TELEHEALTH

The remote exchange of data between a patient at home and their clinicians.

Telehealth equipment can take measurements such as blood pressure, weight, blood oxygen saturation levels, ECG rhythm, temperature and other vital signs.




TELECARE

Remote real time monitoring to manage the risks associated with independent living.

Examples include alarms, sensors, GPS, medication reminders.

Alerts can be sent linked to a 'call monitoring centre' where a response could range from advice to an emergency call out.


Care Homes to Out of Hours

- Worked with OOH to understand the process and prepare IT equipment.

Speech and Language Therapy to Care Homes

- Directing a carer, via video link through a Swallowing assessment.
- Prompt access to SLT reduces patient deterioration, hospital admissions while time travel & cost for services.
- Also aim to improve patient experience and reduce waiting times.
- Held requirements workshops with care homes and other stakeholders to understand key themes.
- Identified a care home with an in-house SLT specialist nurse & trialling virtual SLT hospital appointment.

- Care Homes

- This National project will seek to improve the quality and efficiency of Medicines Management in Care Homes, by transforming processes and implementing a e-MAR solutions.
- It will develop a framework for the procurement of e-MARs on behalf of Community Pharmacies
- The introduction of a Digital Solution aims to reduce the likelihood of drug errors, medicines waste and introduce oversight and accountability in the current processes.
- Engagement and requirements workshops complete, national project board established, requirements spec complete pending procurement strategy.


Procurement is localised and often reactionary. A joint framework for procurement is required but priorities and scope should be defined.
