- £150m investment in digitising the social care sector.



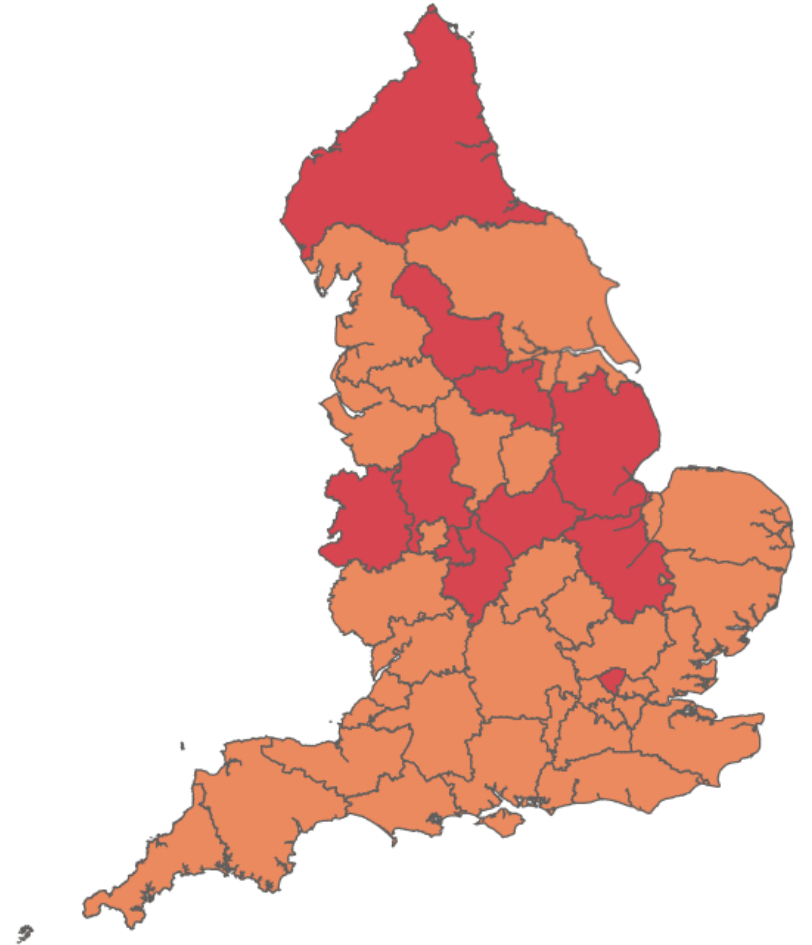
- 80% of Adult social care CQC registered providers will have adopted a digital social care record by March 2024
- 20% of social care providers will have acoustic monitoring solution or equivalent care tech in place by March 2024. This would be targeted at the 20% most at risk residents with social care providers.
- Full deployment of at least one other type of care tech, driven by the benefits case and local need.

DSCR Adoption Progress



- We have an ambitious target of 80% adoption by March 2024 with an interim target of 60% by March 2023.
- The latest CQC data shows that ~50% of care providers now have a DSCR (up from 45% in March 2022)

Baseline position (March 2022)



Benefits

- Reduction in admin time and printing costs
- Improved management and oversight
- Safer and more timely access to information
- Increased compliance with regulations
- Improved safety and quality of care
- Greater personalisation of care

- Around 1 in 3 adults over 65 and half of people over 80 will have at least **one fall** a year.
- Falls cost the NHS over £2 billion per year
- People living with dementia are **four to five times** more likely to fall
- There is strong evidence from smaller-scale pilots that the use of innovative care technologies, such as acoustic monitoring, could reduce hospital admissions as a result of falls in care homes by **20% or more**.

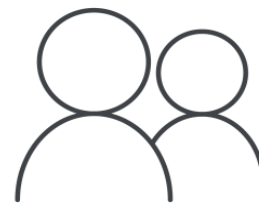

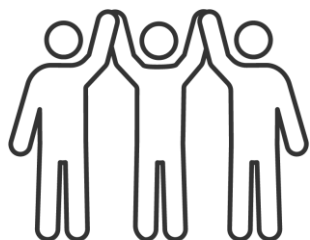

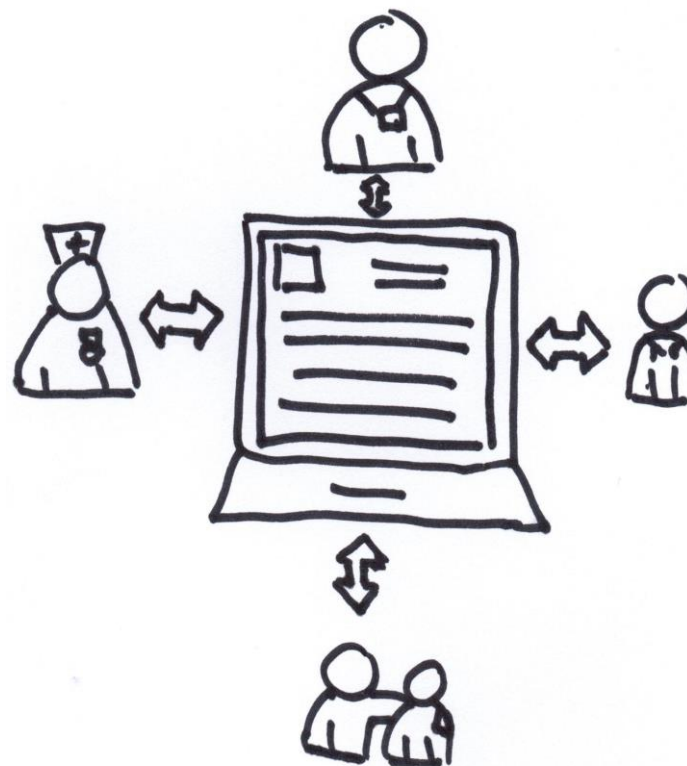
