

Accelerator Reform Fund (ARF)

DHSC launched 24 October



Total of £42.6 million over 2023 to 2025



Kickstart the development of projects which deliver on a list of 12 priorities aligned to DHSC's 10-year vision for social care



Local authorities form consortia within their integrated care system geography



Expectation to work closely with NHS, care providers, voluntary and community organisations, unpaid carers and people drawing on care and support




Non-competitive process – select two or more projects with one specifically focused on unpaid carers



Hands-on support provided by Social Care Institute for Excellence (SCIE)



National evaluation partner commissioned by DHSC



Timeline for the ARF and key milestones

Oct.2023 – DHSC launches ARF 12 weeks EOI process

Jan 2024– Eol deadline

April 2024 – SCIE begins support programme

March 2025 –end of Year 1, SCIE ends support programme

March 2024 – Grants (first tranche) paid out to start projects

Oct 2024 mid-point of Year 1, review and potential redesign, second tranche of grants paid out

2025 – 2026 projects may run into Year 2, and have additional 12 months to deliver

- Each project had to define whether and how they had coproduced the EoI
- Each project needs to define in detail how will they coproduce the initiative

Expression of Interest



 All reports to DHSC require explicit information about coproduction in the projects

Reporting

- Four experts by experience have been recruited
- The Support Programme will have a 'coproduction workstream' made up by two unpaid carers and two adults with needs for care and support
- The workstream will report to the Programme Manager as any other workstream
